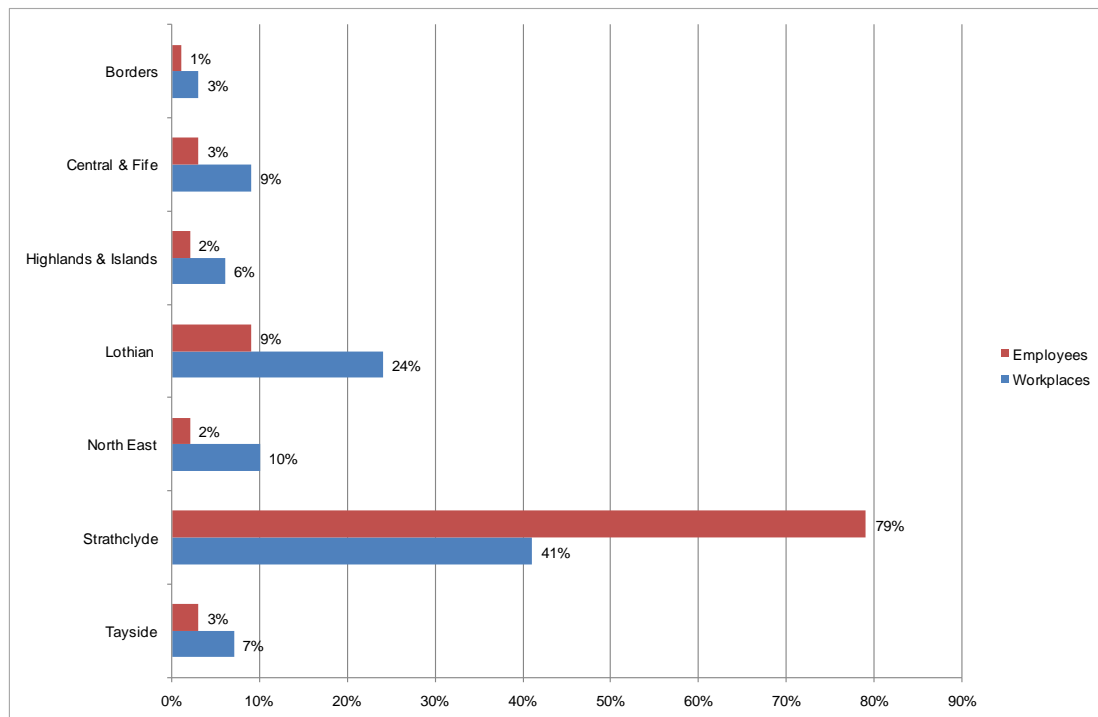

## Occupational Analysis

<b>Broad Occupation Groups</b>			Whilst 37% of employees in the facilities management sector in Scotland are classed as managers and senior officials, this is lower than the proportion seen in other areas of the UK, such as England (48%).  The proportion of employees in administrative and secretarial roles (43%) is significantly higher than the proportion in England (15%) and Wales (17%).
